

1. CURRENT SITUATION:

A. BACKGROUND:

There were two waves of widespread severe weather on April 27, 2011. They first moved through during the early morning hours across northern portions of central Alabama producing widespread damaging straight line winds and isolated tornadoes. The second wave involved numerous supercell thunderstorms and produced long lived, strong to violent tornadoes across the northern two-thirds of central Alabama. There was widespread and catastrophic damage in several locations throughout the State.



CURRENT STATUS/EVENTS:

Today: Areas of dense fog before 9am. Otherwise, sunny, with a high near 69. North wind between 5 and 15 mph.

Tonight: Clear, with a low around 41. North wind between 5 and 10 mph becoming calm.

Thursday: Sunny, with a high near 72. Calm wind becoming east around 5 mph.

continued, we had to depend more heavily on resources that were available from the USACE and from Garner (a contractor). USACE staged generators at Maxwell AFB and assessment teams were made available to assist communities with their generator needs. Garner staged generators at John Hunter Park in Huntsville, AL and hook-up and re-fueling teams were available.
