



1. CURRENT SITUATION:

A. BACKGROUND:

There were two waves of widespread severe weather on April 27, 2011. The first moved through during the early morning hours across northern portions of central Alabama producing widespread damaging straight line winds and isolated tornadoes. The second wave involved numerous supercell thunderstorms and produced long lived, strong to violent tornadoes across the northern two-thirds of central Alabama. There was widespread and catastrophic damage in several locations throughout the State.



CURRENT STATUS/EVENTS:

Tonight: A 40 percent chance of showers after 1am. Partly cloudy, with a low around 64. South wind between 5 and 10 mph.

Tuesday: Showers and possibly a thunderstorm. Temperature falling to around 57 by 5pm. South wind 5 to 15 mph becoming north. Chance of precipitation is 90%.

Tuesday Night: A chance of showers before 1am. Mostly cloudy during the early evening, then gradual clearing, with a low around 39. North wind between 5 and 10 mph. Chance of precipitation is 30%.

C. IMPACT ON BUSINESSES:

- Numerous reports of businesses damaged or destroyed throughout the state. Numbers pending at this time.
- Kroger, food safety specialist, plan of action is as follows:
 1. All perishable food coolers have been roped off and stores have been informed not to sell to public.
 2. No stores encountered structural damage, only loss of electricity.
 3. Dumpsters have been contracted to bring in for disposable of perishable foods.

4. Security has been hired to guard dumpsters from theft or dumpster divers.
 5. Generators are being brought in to restore power so stores can open pharmacies and dry good areas.
- Publix Stores
 1. All stores in Alabama are open and did not suffer any structural damage
 2. They are not offering any fresh products at this time
 3. They have additional generators en route and plan on resuming full operations once power is restored

D. UTILITIES:

- **POTABLE WATER/SEWAGE TREATMENT SYSTEMS:**

AL Rural Water Association EMC and ALNG EMC have done an excellent job of helping fill generator requests that have come in from communities throughout North Alabama. As requests for back-up power generators continued, we had to depend more heavily on resources that were available from the USACE and from Garner (a contractor). USACE staged generators at Maxwell AFB and assessment teams were made available to assist communities with their generator needs. Garner staged generators at John Hunter Park in Huntsville, AL and hook-up and re-fueling teams were available. Very few back-up power generator requests have been received today (Monday, 02 May 2011) and many generators that have been deployed are now available for re-deployment.

Restoration Plan: Internal and external personnel working disaster issues in Alabama total 930. The loss of power to many AREA customers is directly related to the loss of TVA transmission lines.

- **TVA/AL Electric Cities**

Majority of customers will be back on line in 2 to 3 days, however some customers will be without power for 5 to 8 days due to heavily damaged TVA towers and transmission lines. Some co-ops and municipal owned utilities are in good shape and waiting on power from TVA. Total current outages within TVA's service area now stands at 83,360 (this number does not include the AREA customers). There are 4,000 internal and external personnel working TVA related issues in Alabama.
