

This forecast is based on the NWS spot forecast from Tuesday, June 22 PM. Currents were obtained from several models (West Florida Shelf/USF, TGLO/TAMU, NAVO/NRL) and HFR measurements. The model was initialized from Tuesday satellite imagery analysis (NOAA/NESDIS) and overflight observations. The leading edge may contain tarballs that are not readily observable from the imagery (hence not included in the model initialization). Oil near bay inlets could be brought into that bay by local tidal currents.

Situation Update

- ICP Mobile has been notified that a captain in our Vessels of Opportunity (VOO) program has died today in Gulf Shores, Ala. Our thoughts and prayers are with the individual's family, friends, shipmates, and the VOO fleet during this difficult time. Counselors are en route from the Alabama Department of Mental Health to assist crew members and the VOO community. Additional details are not releaseable at this time as an investigation is being conducted by Gulf Shores Police Department. Questions should be directed to 251-968-2431. The individual's name is being withheld pending notification of next of kin. The VOO fleet, including commercial fishing vessels and charter boats, are the heart of the near shore response to the Deepwater Horizon oil spill.
- **ENVIRONMENTAL:** ADEM Air Ops mission yesterday afternoon concentrated on the coastline from Bon Secour to the west end of Dauphin Island, no sheen was visible offshore. No AM flight due to weather.
- **HEALTH:** On Friday, June 18, 2010, ADPH lifted its advisory for the Mississippi Sound north of Dauphin Island west of the bridge as well as the Gulf fronting beach waters on the south side of Dauphin Island.

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- **TRAJECTORY:** NOAA's Surface Oil Forecast projections indicate developing westward currents within the Mississippi Bight region will begin to inhibit further movement of the slick to the east. Coastal regions between Ship Island, MS and Panama City, FL are threatened by shoreline contacts through Friday, 6/25. (<http://response.restoration.noaa.gov>)

- **OPERATIONS**
 - Offshore: No night operations occurred due to weather. Offshore vessels took opportunity to re-fuel and restock. Skimming will resume today as weather permits.
 - Near shore: Task Forces 2 with - 4 skimmers attached including 1 MARCO V, 1 VOSS, 2 shallow water barge – was not able to conduct skimming operations due to weather. Weather is expected to impact operations today as well. Task Force 4 - with 4 skimmers attached including 1 MARCO V, 1 VOSS, 2 shallow water barges – is expected to skim in protected waters near Perdido Pass. Task Force 5 - with 4 skimmers attached including 1 MARCO V, 1 VOSS, 2 shallow water barges - is expected to skim protected waters near Petit Bois Island near the Alabama - Mississippi state line.  - The Inland Water Skimming Task Force has stood up. They will operate drum skimmers from the following locations: Dauphin Island – 10, Theodore – 6, Bayou la Batre – 5, Perdido Bay – 1. More drum skimmers are on the way.
 - Onshore: Gulf fronting beach cleaning was curtailed yesterday due to rain and lightning. No night operations occurred due to weather.

- **SCAT:** Team 5 worked Alabama yesterday. Team 5 surveyed the Gulf Shores Beach Parking Lot area to Perdido Pass. Sheen, mousse, and beach staining were observed.

- **NAVIGATIONAL RESTRICTIONS:** Perdido Pass has been navigationally restricted according to tide by the US Coast Guard.

- **EDIBLE FISHES:**
 - All Alabama oyster beds remain closed as a precaution.
 - All waters in the Gulf of Mexico including Pelican Bay and the waters of Mobile Bay east of the Mobile Ship Channel and south of a line from Mobile Ship Channel Marker Number 22 to Little Point Clear on the North side of Fort Morgan Peninsula are closed to fishing. See page # 14.

- 80,806 mi² (209,286 km²), or about 33% of the Gulf of Mexico exclusive economic zone remains closed to fishing per the National Marine Fisheries Service, see page # 15.

- Under light winds, sheens generally are more evident.

Skimming Operations

- There are 895 independent vessels of opportunity (VoO) assigned to work Alabama waters. Of those, a total of 818 are working in surveillance and support functions and 77 Independent VoO vessels are capable of skimming oil.
- An additional 8 vessels associated with Task Force 2 & 4 are capable of skimming oil in Alabama waters.
- The total number of vessels capable of skimming oil in Alabama waters is 85.
