1 SITUATION:

A. BACKGROUND:

Black ice will be likely tonight, as temperatures fall below 32 degrees sometime between 7-9pm for all of Alabama north of Montgomery. Any ice or snowmelt that has occurred today will refreeze after this time, and roadways could become treacherous or impassible. Interests are advised to only travel if absolutely necessary.


B. Latest Official NWS Forecast:

Through Noon:

For the northern third of the state, expect to see 1-3 more inches of snow, with the heaviest totals east of Interstate 65. Snow can be expected from Marion to Cherokee counties, as well, but smaller accumulations can be expected in these areas (Less than 1/4" of an inch in Marion to about 1/2" in Cherokee.)

South of Interstate 20 to the Interstate 85 corridor and east of Interstate 65, a mix of freezing rain and sleet can be expected with less than 1/4" in accumulations.

This afternoon:

The system pulls off to the east and takes with it the majority of the activity. There will still be a chance of light freezing rain and drizzle for areas east of Interstate 65 and north of the Interstate 85 corridor. Accumulations should generally be less than one tenth of an inch.

Tonight:

Some moisture may wrap around the back side of the system, causing flurries across the northern half of the state. No accumulations are expected.

The biggest problem is temperatures. Tuesday might be the warmest day this week and that's only 34-35 degrees (and colder) for the areas that have seen most of the snow/ice. Wednesday and Thursday's highs are going to be right around the freezing mark for this area. This may cause the snow/ice that is on the ground to stick around for the next couple of days. Temperatures should climb into the 40s by Friday and

even warmer for the weekend.
