

## ALDOT Road Closures:

### Bibb

- SR 5 between MP 93 and MP 94 in Bibb County. Road blocked with trees from storm.

### Blount

- U.S. 31 Northbound and southbound from Blount Springs/Garden City milepost 287.8 to the Cullman County Line milepost 291 all lanes are closed. The lanes are closed due to trees on the roadway.
- SR79 north of US278 at Marshall County Line. Trees and power lines down
- SR75 one mile north of Oneonta. Power line down
- SR67 from U.S. Hwy 231 back to Cullman Co. Line. Trees and power lines down all along this route.
- U.S. Hwy. 231, (2)two miles north of U.S. Hwy. 278. Trees and power lines down across U.S. Hwy 231

- AL 91 in Hanceville area. Hanceville PD is allowing access to local citizens only due to debris and downed power lines.
