

1. CURRENT SITUATION:

A. BACKGROUND:

There were two waves of widespread severe weather on April 27, 2011. They first moved through during the early morning hours across northern portions of central Alabama producing widespread damaging straight line winds and isolated tornadoes. The second wave involved numerous supercell thunderstorms and produced long lived, strong to violent tornadoes across the northern two-thirds of central Alabama. There was widespread and catastrophic damage in several locations throughout the



CURRENT STATUS/EVENTS:

B. This Afternoon:

Sunday: Lingering isolated storms in Division A and B, otherwise partly cloudy; areas of fog forming in southern AL.

Lows 63 to 68, chance of rain 25% for northern Alabama, 0-10% elsewhere winds southwest 4-9 mph.

Monday: Very warm, more humid; isolated t-storm in Divs. A & B.
