FEMA-1971-DR Designated Counties: 1645 hrs: 05/03/2011

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

1. CURRENT SITUATION:

A. BACKGROUND:

There were two waves of widespread severe weather on April 27, 2011. The first moved through during the early morning hours across northern portions of central Alabama producing widespread damaging straight line winds and isolated tornadoes. The second wave involved numerous supercell thunderstorms and produced long lived, strong to violent tornadoes across the northern two-thirds of central Alabama. There was widespread and catastrophic damage in several locations throughout the State.



CURRENT STATUS/EVENTS:

Tonight: Showers, mainly before 10pm. Low around 36. North wind between 5 and 10 mph becoming calm. Chance of precipitation is 80%.

Wednesday: Sunny, with a high near 69. Calm wind becoming north between 10 and 15 mph.

Wednesday Night: Clear, with a low around 40. North wind between 5 and 10 mph becoming calm.

Thursday: Sunny, with a high near 72. Calm wind becoming east around 5 mph.

AL Rural Water Association EMC and ALNG EMC have done an excellent job of helping fill generator requests that have come in from communities throughout North Alabama. As requests for back-up power generators

continued, we had to depend more heavily on resources that were available from the USACE and from Garner (a contractor). USACE staged generators at Maxwell AFB and assessment teams were made available to assist communities with their generator needs. Garner staged generators at John Hunter Park in Huntsville, AL and hook-up and re-fueling teams were available.

Restoration Plan: Internal and external personnel working disaster issues in Alabama peaked at 4,000. External personnel came from 8 States including Tennessee, Mississippi, Kentucky, Georgia, North Carolina, Virginia, Florida and Pennsylvania. Top 5 priority transmission lines being repaired are

Trinity-Nance 161kV, East Point-Hanceville-Bremen 161kV, Browns Ferry-Madison 500kV, Browns Ferry-Trico-Trinity 500kV, and Browns Ferry-Limestone 500kV. Some co-ops and municipal owned utilities are in good shape and waiting on power from TVA.




