THE FIRST ROUND WILL BE ASSOCIATED WITH ISOLATED  
SUPERCELLS THAT MAY DEVELOP AHEAD OF A COLD  
FRONT. AREAS WEST OF I 65 WILL HAVE THE BEST CHANCE  
AT SEEING THIS ISOLATED CONVECTION AS EARLY AS 3 PM.  
WHILE AREAS EAST OF I 65 WILL SEE A BETTER CHANCE  
AFTER 5 PM. WITH THESE ISOLATED SUPERCELLS...LARGE  
HAIL...DAMAGING WIND...AND TORNADOES WILL ALL BE  
POSSIBLE.

THE SECOND WAVE WILL BE ASSOCIATED WITH THE COLD FRONT THAT WILL LIKELY DEVELOP IN EASTERN MISSISSIPPI THIS EVENING. LOOK FOR DAMAGING WINDS AND LARGE HAIL TO IMPACT THE WESTERN PORTIONS OF CENTRAL ALABAMA AS EARLY AS 8 PM. AN ISOLATED TORNADO CAN NOT BE RULED OUT. THIS SQUALL LINE WILL TRAVERSE THE STATE LASTING WELL INTO THE OVERNIGHT HOURS. THE LINE SHOULD SHOW SIGNS OF WEAKENING OVER EASTERN ALABAMA BY 4 AM.




