1. CURRENT SITUATION:

- A. BACKGROUND:** The winter weather on January 28, 2014 was caused by the combination of an arctic cold front and overriding gulf moisture. This overriding gulf moisture lead to the wintry mixture of precipitation observed across Central and Southern Alabama. Weather models begin to indicate the possibility for wintry precipitation as early as late Friday into early Saturday. The possibility for wintry weather was added to the Hazardous Weather Outlook (HWO) over the weekend as the forecast and models began to zero in on the situation. A Winter Storm Watch was issued on Sunday before being upgraded to a Winter Storm Warning on Monday.
- B. CURRENT STATUS:** Temperatures are in the mid teens to low 30s throughout the state. Temperatures in the NWS Mobile region will rise slowly and are expected to barely rise to the freezing point in the noon to 2pm time frame.
- C. FUTURE SUMMARY/IMPACT:** Precipitation will progress to the southeast throughout the afternoon and evening hours before exiting southeastern portions of the state during the early morning hours on Wednesday. The surface temperatures will drop Wednesday afternoon causing the melted slush to refreeze into black ice. Temperatures throughout the state will be in the low teens to low 20s.



County Shelter Status as of 0500 hrs Winter Weather: 01/29/2014


